Douglass A. Carr, age 81, died Saturday, October 3, 2015 in Columbus, Ohio. Born November 3, 1933 in Columbus, Ohio to parents Alice Aldrich Carr and Byron Douglass Carr who preceded in him in death. He attended Culver and Columbia Military Academies returning to graduate from Grandview Heights High School with the class of 1951. Graduated from The Ohio State University in 1955 where he was an active member in Tau Kappa Epsilon Fraternity. He did post graduate work at The Ohio State University, University of Utah and University of Arizona. He was an Intelligence Officer in the U.S. Army retiring as a Lt. Colonel after 20 years of service. Upon retirement, he continued to serve the U.S. Government in the field of intelligence in Exempted Service for ten more years. Returned home to Columbus and kept busy as President of Douglass Investment Co., Inc. Douglas had an inquiring mind, a deep interest in many subjects and enjoyed imparting his knowledge to others.
