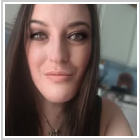
A Celebration of Life service will be held at a later date. Arrangements are under the direction of the Callaham Funeral Home, Inez, Kentucky.

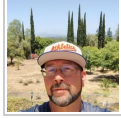
Edit: I had forgotten he didn't attend the same elementary school, but I knew him anyway. Perhaps little league baseball or something like that.

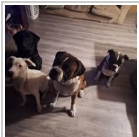
