Died: November 18, 2019 - Tallahassee, FL

Bud left Lenore in 1942 at the age of 17 to join the Marines and serve in WWII. While in the Marines, he served in St. Thomas, USVI, was a tail gunner in a Douglas SBD Dauntless dive bomber for the VMS3 Squadron Devil Birds, and fought on Iwo Jima and Okinawa, Japan where he earned a purple heart. He met Alice Jean Livingston at a Coke machine on a Navy base in Norman, Oklahoma and were married two weeks later just before he left for overseas duty. They were married for 57 years until her death in 2001. Bud and Alice Jean had two sons, Leon "Sonny", who passed away in 2000 and Richard. He was an ordained minister and deacon at Orchard Farm Baptist Church in St. Charles, Missouri and a chaplain in the Sheriff's Department there. Bud kept a daily diary beginning when he was 12 years old with a wealth of information and historical documentation. He loved to paint and gave many of his paintings away to friends and family. He was a member of Community Baptist Church, the Marine Corp League, the Historical Society and the Tallahassee Clock Makers.

Bud was preceded in death by his parents, Marion and Florence Ledson, four sisters; Sinda Floyd, Bertha Smith, Mable Hall and Dora "Sis" Mayberry, and step-brother Gus Thompson.

Bud is survived by his brother, Marion Clay Ledson Jr, of Lenore, WV and his son Richard Lee Ledson, daughter-in-law, Benna, of Tallahassee, FL two grandchildren, Richard Lee Ledson II. of New York, NY and Tiffany Ledson Wendland of Street, MD, four great-grandchildren, Richard "Tres" Ledson of Dyess Air Force Base, TX, Mackenzie Ledson-Ellwein of Albuquerque, NM, and Sierra and Colton Wendland of Street, MD .

Services will be held with a full Military Honor Guard at Bethany Old Regular Baptist Church in Lenore, WV at 5:00 pm on Friday, Nov. 22. He will be laid to rest at the Ledson

Family Cemetery on Saturday, November 23 at 11:00 am.

Bud will be missed by his family and many friends who loved him, his singing, and his stories.
